

Eva's, a Caribbean kitchen in South Laguna, is a small but popular dining spot known for its superb West Indies cuisine, including the jumbo shrimp breaded with coconut and served with a mango chutney, the pan-roasted Chilean sea bass with a tropical salsa, and the cornmeal-dredged Louisiana catfish. Reggae and steel drum music can usually be heard during dinner. If the restaurant is crowded – which it frequently is – the service can take an extra few minutes. But, as the menu notes, “we are on Caribbean time. You can't rush a good thing. Like good loving, it takes time and care.” Don't worry – the food at Eva's is worth the wait. Bring your appetite and leave your cares behind.
